- Always stay in control. You must be able to stop, or avoid other people or objects.
- People ahead of you have the rightof-way. It is your responsibility to

- Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- 5 If you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remai at the scene and identify yourself to
- 6 Always use proper devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- 7 Observe and obey all posted signs and warnings
- Keep off closed trails and closed
- You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impaired through use of alcohol or drugs.
- You must have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to safely load, ride and unload lifts. If in doubt, ask the lift attendant.

Guided snowshoe tours are available daily at 9:30am, 11:30am and 2:00pm. There are 3 different trails — beginner, intermediate and advanced (Green, Blue and Black trails). To ensure availability, it is strongly recommended to book ahead by calling 1-403-591-7777 Ext. 901.

Nakiska Ski Area's snowshoe trail use will be limited to Guided Snowshoe Tours. To use these trails, please check in for your tour at Guest Services. Snowshoe Rentals will also be available to the public for local trails.

GREEN TRAIL: This densely wooded 2 km trail begins with a scenic lift ride from Nakiska base area to the Mid-Mountain Lodge. Ideal for families looking to explore the nature of Kananaskis.

BLUE TRAIL: Beginning at the Mid-Mountain Lodge, this gentle descent winds through a 4.1 km double track trail.

Ideal for larger groups.

BLACK TRAIL: Looking for a workout? This 4.1 km double track ascends from the base area of Nakiska to the Mid-Mountain Lodge. You'll be rewarded with a scenic chairlift ride back down.
